<u>November income of \$22,584</u> for the church includes member giving of \$15,227, transfer and fundraising income of \$6,593, and other income of \$764. Member giving for the month was below budget, below last year's level, and well below our expenses for the month.

Fundraising and Transfers: During the month, we used \$1,700 from the Mortgage Reduction Fund, \$385 from Bold Statement, \$25 from the Music fund, and \$200 from the Hospitality fund. We also used the remaining \$1,610 of the Golf tournament funds. We recorded additional Oktoberfest proceeds of \$173. We also accessed \$2,500 of the remaining funds from the Academy closure to assist with bill payment.

Expenses for the church were \$27,959 for the month of November. Expenses were above budget, and above levels during October 2016. A couple of one-time items contributed to the higher expense levels: we paid the golf tournament expenses of \$1,504 during the month, and we also received a \$902 assessment from the City of Tampa for sewer/drain upkeep.

Overall, we recorded a loss for the month of (\$5,375).

<u>Designated Funds Flows:</u> We received \$3,140 in designated contributions during the month. We used \$4,069 in designated and golf tournament funds (see transfers, above), which reduced the balance in our Designated Funds account. Our November-end balance was \$18,834, down from \$19,764 at the end of October.

Looking out to 2018:

The congregation has approved a Spending Plan that includes expenses of \$303,091 in 2018, or a little over \$25,000/month. Giving to LCOS at current levels would pay for about 11 months' worth of our 2018 expenses. As you look ahead to next year, please consider your ability to provide an extra month of giving to LCOS during 2018. If each member did so, it would go a long way toward easing our financial challenges.

INDONESIAN INSPIRED ZOODLES Adapted from HalfBakedHarves.com



¹/₂ pound gluten free brown rice noodles or pasta of your choice
1/3 cup creamy peanut or seed butter
1/3 cup tahini paste
3 tablespoons coconut aminos (or Bragg's Liquid Aminos, Tamari, or low sodium soy sauce)
2 - 3 pitted dates, soaked in warm water for 5 minutes and drained
3 tablespoons fresh lime juice
1¹/₂ teaspoons Sambal Oelek
1/3 cup almond, hemp, soy, rice, oat or cashew milk
3 medium size zucchini, spiralized
¹/₂ cup roasted peanuts or seeds finely chopped
1 cup fresh basil chopped
⁶/₂ cup fresh cilantro chopped
6 baby bell peppers sliced
1 cup cherry tomatoes halved
1 jalapeño pepper sliced (optional)

1. Combine the peanut or seed butter, tahini, coconut aminos, dates, lime juice, Sambal Oelek and nondairy milk in a high speed blender and blend well.

2. Cook the pasta per instructions and drain.

3. Spiralize the zucchini into a large serving bowl. Add the sauce, peanuts or seeds, basil, cilantro, peppers and tomatoes.

4. Add the hot pasta and toss well to combine making sure to coat the zoodles and pasta.

5. Serve warm or let cool to room temperature. Garnish with your choice of peanuts or seeds, cilantro, basil, peppers or tomatoes.
