

#### SERMON

Dear disciples of Jesus: Grace and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus. Amen.

Here we are, third Sunday of Advent, last month of 2020, a very complicated year, a very frustrating year, a very challenging year, a year that the whole world will remember as the year that everybody wants to forget.

Today after all that we have been experiencing in 2020, the Lord says to us with the words of the apostle Paul:

<sup>16</sup>Rejoice always, <sup>17</sup>pray without ceasing, <sup>18</sup>give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Let me repeat these words again: <sup>16</sup>Rejoice always, <sup>17</sup>pray without ceasing, <sup>18</sup>give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Rejoice. Pray. Give thanks and do it in all, yes, in all circumstances!

When I read this text I said to God: seriously Lord? Seriously? Do You think that is possible? Do You think it is possible to rejoice in 2020, to pray in 2020, to give thanks for 2020? And the Lord answered, *yes*, <sup>16</sup>*Rejoice always*, <sup>17</sup>*pray without ceasing*, <sup>18</sup>*give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you*. God declares that this is God's will for all of us.

Rejoice. Paul invites us to rejoice. And Paul was a man that experienced a lot of challenges and tribulations. He was a man that said about his own life and ministry:

I have worked much harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death again and again. <sup>24</sup> Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. <sup>25</sup> Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was pelted with stones, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea, <sup>26</sup> I have been constantly on the move. I have been in danger from rivers, in danger from bandits, in danger from my fellow Jews, in danger from Gentiles; in danger in the city, in danger in the country, in danger at sea; and in danger from false believers. <sup>27</sup> I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known hunger and thirst and have often gone without food; I have been cold and naked. 2 Corinthians 11, 23-27. This is the same man that suffered all of these disgraces not only for a day, or a year, but during his whole ministry life, and he is the one that says to us: rejoice.

#### How can this be possible?

I think because this is exactly the power of the gospel, the power of the living presence of the living God acting and strengthening us from the inside to face and fight what we face and fight outside.

Paul speaks from his sufferings, from his experience of the cross, not only emotionally, or spiritually but also physically. Paul is a man that following the example of Jesus can describe himself as a man of sorrows, but this man of sorrows declares from the deep of his heart: Rejoice always! What is his secret to rejoice always? How can a man of sorrows rejoice always? How can someone sufferings the vicissitudes of 2020 rejoice always?

Given the presence of our anxieties in this year full of challenges and difficulties, for us who are overwhelmed by stress or lost living in grief, Paul's invitation is authentically countercultural but a faithful response to a world that is consumed by uncertainty. Paul gives us an antidote to the pandemic of fear: Rejoice always!

And he shares the secret formula to reach this possibility of permanent joy. He says: <sup>17</sup>*pray without ceasing*. It is clear that today everybody has experienced in many different ways the power of prayer. Even people that do not believe in a supernatural world believe in the transformative power of prayer helping the transformation of an individual when facing a difficult time.

Christians believe in the transformative and supernatural power of prayer. But not occasional prayer, not sporadic prayer. Paul is inviting us to see our life as a permanent prayer, a prayer without ceasing.

Emerson made the following observation: "It is not only when we audibly and in form, address our petitions to the God that we pray. We pray without ceasing. Every secret wish is a prayer. Every house is a church; the corner of every street is a closet of devotion"<sup>1</sup>

To pray without ceasing in the end is to be aware of the presence of God in every instant of our life, in every breath, in every heartbeat, in every step, in every view, in every tear, in every act of mercy, in every thought and question. To pray without ceasing is to recognize that we are permanently in the presence of God, that our whole world is an altar of prayer and our whole life in words, thoughts and deeds is the constant prayer to the omnipresent God.

Prayer is the element that helps us to integrate our reality inside into the outside. Because in prayer we contemplate, we discern, we see, we express and we proclaim to God and the world what is important.

Our prayers are constant, because we are constantly communicating with God in heart and mind, in words and deeds, whoever we are and wherever we go. Prayer is constant because the whole life of a Christian is of permanent prayers, since we are permanently in the presence of God.

It doesn't matter what kind of prayer prevails in your life, mental prayer, contemplative prayer, silent prayer, verbal prayer, individual prayer, or prayer in solitude, it doesn't matter if you use your own words or read somebody else's

words, it doesn't matter if you do it in different hours of the day. The reality is that any time that you are opening your heart and mind to what is happening around you, the Holy Spirit is moving you to find God's presence in prayer.

It is the Holy Spirit who is always inviting us to pray, because God always wants to be in touch with his children.

It is this amazing experience of the constant presence of God in our lives what moves us to <sup>18</sup>give thanks in all circumstances, then joy turns out to be a permanent reality, because gratitude comes from the bottom of our heart and is transformed in amazing joy. We experience joy because we permanently live in the presence of God and we are blessed by the Holy Spirit. Our heart full of gratitude gives thanks and therefore joy grows more and more.

Paul says: *this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you*. That, my siblings in Christ, is what God wants for all his children always. A constant experience of God that is expressed in gratitude brings an explosion of joy, constant and unlimited joy.

No pandemic can destroy this joy, because our joy it is not human-made. It is a divine gift, a constant reminder that we live and move in the constant presence of God, guided by the Holy Spirit and united with Jesus Christ.

So: <sup>16</sup>*Rejoice always*, <sup>17</sup>*pray without ceasing*, <sup>18</sup>*give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.* Amen.



Our Monthly Need for December 2020 is:\$29,351Giving received to support LCOS Ministries through 12/13:\$8,207


#### Mortgage Reduction Fund


