SERMON

Dear disciples of Jesus:

Grace and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus. Amen.

It is Advent Season. Advent Season is marked by the notion of waiting for the Lord. Not only waiting for Christmas that celebrates Jesus's first coming but waiting for his return, his second coming, what the Bible calls the *Parousia*, the return of the Lord to establish his kingdom forever.

For this reason, in today's gospel, Jesus is inviting us to prepare for his second coming with a contemplative attitude. Jesus says: "Look at the fig tree and all the

trees; ³⁰as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. ³¹So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near."

An attitude of contemplation throughout the day helps to keep us centered. Contemplation can mean slowing down enough to look at the trees and flowers on a walk, listening wholeheartedly to a friend or relative, or savoring a meal with the family at the end of the day when enjoying the time together. Contemplative attitude means to remember that God is always speaking to us, but we need to slow down enough to listen to what God is trying to show us in the ordinary world. We tend to be very busy, in a hurry, and in this time of Advent and Christmas we tend to forget that the reason for Christmas is the joy of Christ coming to us. It is not the shopping, not the rush, not the gifts, not the lights, not the ornaments, but Christ Jesus coming to us to give us joy and salvation.

What a challenge is to develop a contemplative attitude today and especially in this season. The world is bombing us with lots of advertisement and noise that we tend to end tired and confused. The Silent Night tends to be replaced by busy days and nights shopping and running from one store to another.

Jesus is inviting us to discover his presence and his coming with the kingdom contemplating what is around us, the world, nature, people, facts, and to discover in this ordinary presence the extraordinary that is ready to transform us.

Contemplation means to pay attention to the larger spiritual, cosmic, moral drama that is taking place. The scripture says in Titus 2: For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, 12 training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and

godly, 13 while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Begin with the end in mind. The end of the world may not be coming soon, but the end of our life/world could be here before we expect it. We need for this reason to live in the present time *lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, while we wait for our Savior.* Contemplative life waiting the Lord means to live actively the Christian faith showing the world that we are waiting for the Lord doings God´s work, preaching through our deeds, serving our neighbors and always focus on the person of Jesus and his example of holy living.

For this reason, wake up. Don't live carelessly, don't waste your time in consumerism or in stressful and destructive relationships. Tune in to God's purposes. Know that all the lights of the world are not permanent, only God's new creation will last forever.

Jesus clearly calls our attention when he says: Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life.

We are tempted to allow pessimism, negativity, and destructive thoughts to make room in our life and consume us with the *worries of this life*. But Jesus is inviting us to oppose all those destructive forces contemplating that his kingdom is coming with him to bring fullness and total redemption.

Because he is coming the fulfillment of the divine promises are now visible contemplating the creation and the blessings that God is always giving us. Because he is coming, we are not afraid of the storms, challenges and *worries of this life*.

I invite you for this reason to develop a contemplative attitude during this Advent Season. Try to focus on Jesus, find Jesus' presence and words, read the scriptures and meditate in the readings for Advent and Christmas. Rejoice in the message of salvation, liberation, healing, forgiveness, and fullness that God is sending you.

Contemplate the beauty of the world, the beauty of nature and find in the creation the marks of the creator, the love of the creator that is declaring that this creation was made for you, for your enjoyment, your security and your happiness.

Contemplate the miracles that God is always bringing into your life and the lives of others and see how Christ is always saving and protecting, guiding, and leading his flock to the promise land of his future coming.

Contemplate and find in your contemplation the strength to live *lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly.* Lives that are productive and ready to be a blessing to other lives. Be ready to manifest that this season is not commercials and shopping, but it is about redemption, love, and God´s salvation coming to people that are living in need, in despair and in brokenness but that now in Jesus that is coming to us have the promise of eternal life and a blessed present-future.

Rejoice and be glad, our Lord is coming, and his kingdom is our future.

Amen.
