What a pleasure it is to serve with you to accomplish your founding purpose.

Vision statement: Through LCOS, all come to know the unconditional love of God and grow in their faith and share their love and faith with others.

Mission statement: That all may experience the love of Jesus Christ. We reach up through worship celebration; we reach out by sharing our faith; and we reach in through prayer and study.

In the past few weeks, I have met with the Call Committee, the Council, the Lay Pastor Care team and watched the Kaye Prox Food Bank. I have also met with members in their homes and in my office. I listened carefully and shared some thoughts along the way. My conclusion is that LCOS takes seriously their vision and mission statements. You can see this in how you care for each other, and in the future ideas the council is discussing.

The council has taken the first step of applying for a V2A grant. While this is far from being approved by the Synod, the “building bridges” pre-packaged program is the one highlighted by the council. Many thanks to our President Sara Berge and Kristi Saligame (Thiese) for submitting the initial application. While there has been some conversation about the who and how that would be lived out, no one direction or plan has been developed. The council is just beginning to consider the direction. And there are different thoughts among the members of the council, as it should be. Again, nothing has been determined. The grant would be \$10,000. If we receive it, it will give a great start to do new outreach programming. New programming will help us reach out to new people in the Town and Country neighborhood and beyond. This is an exciting opportunity for LCOS.

One thing that will not change is our mission and vision. It remains as certain as when it was first developed. As quoted above, our vision statement is clear, concise, and it is centered on our faith and scriptures. The unconditional love of God and welcome to all people remain a certain as always. One thing that has impressed me most is the diversity of our congregation. As I look out at our congregation each week, I feel so very proud to be a part of our church that is made up of different backgrounds, cultures, languages and colors. This is a clear testament that you take seriously your mission and vision.

Please know that as we think about the future, we will not forget the past, or the present. Each person who is in our church is extremely important. No one wishes to change the character and make-up of those who already sit in our pews. Truly, this is a caring and loving congregation. I felt it the minute I met with your council and it is reaffirmed with every day I continue to get to know each one of you. LCOS recorded a net gain of \$1753 in May however year to date we show a loss of \$14,004 largely because the new air conditioning unit was paid for with surplus funds from 2025. A new commercial fridge was purchased for the kitchen using fellowship designated funds. Your faithful support continues to serve our members and neighbors in the surrounding community.



Kaye Prox Food Bank: Kristi Saligame

Continues to serve 350+ families weekly with faithful volunteers. The heat continues to be a challenge for the volunteers and clients. Overhead fans have been installed in the pavilion to assist with air flow. We celebrated a big birthday for Angel Vasquez who turned 70 with volunteers and clients. The Food bank distributes Monday and Wednesday at 11:30am and Friday at 2:30pm. Technology: Sara Berge

An upgrade on the sound system continues as Pastor Bruce has been available. He plans to have speakers in the nursery and narthex working as soon as his electrician is available. Microsoft business accounts for non-profit institutions have changed recently and we will need to update to meet the church's needs.

Facilities and Grounds: Don Richardson

Thank you to Don Richardson, Martin Stewart and Ernie Largent for keeping our property looking so nice.

Fans have been installed in the back Pavilion to assist with air flow during food distribution for the Food bank but plan to modify for stronger air flow. Century Fire completed overhead irrigation work need after fire inspection. Hoping to begin repair of the pillars in the main entrance area when equipment and man power available.

Community Outreach: Kristi Saligame

Plan to move forward with offering English/Spanish classes to the community along with basic financial classes when instructors are available.

Group Projects: Sara Berge

After lunch the council cleaned out the choir stairwells removing worn equipment, went through more files in the front office and continued to clean out the area behind the stage in Luther Hall.

LCOS Treasurer's Report—June 2026

June Financial Review:

Church **income** in June was **\$24,807**, vs our budget of \$26,310 and last year's result of \$20,657.

Member Giving in June was \$16,432, right in line with budget of \$16,400 and a little below year-ago gifts of \$17,505.

We used Bold Statement funds of \$5,000 during the month.

Facilities income was \$3,375 in June, vs. \$3,152 a year ago.

Church **expense** was **\$21,620** in June, vs. \$24,073 a year ago and our budget of \$27,176.

We made a \$4,813 downpayment on our combined insurance policies with Liberty Mutual, which boosted our Facilities & Grounds expense.

Our employee compensation/benefits expense was below budget (the plan includes spending for pastoral health care benefits and a part-time office manager, neither of which happened in June).

Other expense categories were in generally line with expectations. LCOS recorded a **net gain** of **\$2,987** in June.

In the IK-Synod, they encourage you to be ordained in the yearly assembly, but I chose to do so at my home church, and I am very glad I did. My home church in Fort Wayne, IN was a part of my entire life. I often kid that I think my Mother stopped on the way home from Lutheran hospital to have me baptized. For my entire youth, this church was my life.

The day of my Ordination, I was surprised that the entire church was packed. Most all of the members over my life were there. And, I would have never been ordained without them. It was heart-warming to see them. Of course, my family was there. Aunts and uncles, my Mother, Brother and friends. At first, it was a bit chaotic, I remember a couple of classmates were unable to attend, but my friends filled in.

The Bishop was there, but more important was the man who was my Pastor. I always say he knew I would become a pastor long before I did. I think he had seven of eight young people become pastors from our church. It was a very meaningful day.

Actually, a very strong memory was when I had to kneel for the laying on of hands with officials and colleagues. They did not have a kneeler so I had to kneel trying to keep my back straight. I remember it being uncomfortable and I thought they might never let me up! Still, all went well.

I can remember the homily the Bishop gave and I remember looking around the church that had groomed me and all the memories of that church and all my experiences there. There was a great sense of peace.

Since I had already received a call from my first congregation, because it was not too far from where I grew up, several members of that congregation were there as well. As it turns out, my first call was where my Father and Grandmother and Great-grandparent attended. So, I thought of how all of those pieces of my life and history came together on that one day. It was a homecoming and a sending all wrapped up in one beautiful day.

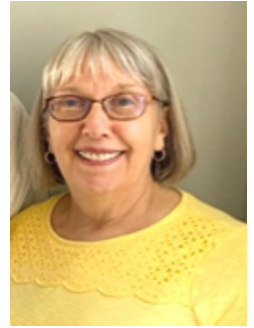

Introduce yourself to Vlad the next time you see him and welcome him to our LCOS family.

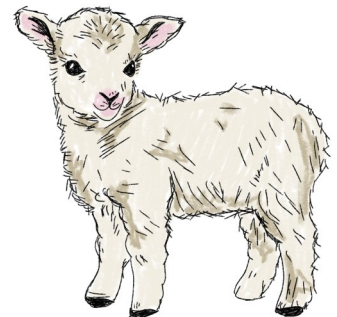
Carried and Called to Follow
